Consortium Committees 4/2023

SG-OMM Committee

(Currently still soliciting nominations for seating)

The project is labeled the "OM&M" Committee (operation, maintenance, and monitoring). This committee is tasked to create a new ANSI/AARST standard that establishes minimum requirements for long-term stewardship of mitigation systems and monitoring for buildings identified as having indoor radon or soil gas hazards.

"NCSG" Standing Committee

(Currently still soliciting nominations for seating)

New construction design to mitigation radon/soil gas hazards. This standing committee is tasked to update, harmonize, and improve new construction standards that include CCAH/RRNC (homes) and CC-1000 (large buildings).

"MIT" Standing Committee

Radon/soil gas mitigation standards. This committee is tasked to update, harmonize, and improve SGM-SF (homes); RMS-MF (multifamily buildings); and RMS-MF (schools and large buildings).

"MEAS" Standing Committee

Radon measurement standards. This committee is tasked to update, harmonize, and improve MAH (homes); MAMF (multifamily buildings); and MALB (schools and large buildings).

"QA" Standing Committee

Radon test device quality assurance. This committee is tasked to update, harmonize, and improve MS-PC (measurement system performance criteria); and MS-QA (measurement system quality assurance).

"Radon in Water" Standing Committee

Measurement and mitigation of radon in water. This committee is tasked to update, harmonize, and improve MW-RN (protocol for collection, transfer, and measurement of radon in water). This committee is also tasked to create a new ANSI/AARST designated as AARST RMS-W (mitigation of radon in water).

About Consortium Participation

Participation includes regularly scheduled webinar meetings typically every 2 weeks when active. After about three years, standing committees are refreshed/reseated. Attendance and acceptance of conduct policies are required. However, 100% attendance is not required and a person can withdraw from the committee at any time.

Persons are seated by virtue of personal experience and vantage point. Seating seeks a balance of unique vantage points from diverse stakeholder interest groups. There is a designated voting and an alternate voting seat available for each stakeholder interest group.

All participants are to abide by the Consortium Code of Conduct. Opinions expressed are not to be considered as formal positions of their employer or all members of the stakeholder interest group they might be listed as representing.
